Show Dates and Times:

Showmanship: 8 am on Sunday, June 9

Breed Classes: 10 am following showmanship

Release: 4 pm - Sunday, June 9

Entry Fee: \$10 per goat

Premiums: First through third place -\$4, \$2, \$1

Ribbons: First through third place, Division Grand and Reserve Champion.

Show Rules:

The registration form must be signed and dated or the form will be returned. Goats must be shorn or combed between January 1, 2019 and June 1, 2019.

A minimum of one ounce of fleece (preferably whole fleece) must be placed in a clear plastic bag, available for judging by 8am Saturday, June 8 and be available at ringside or accompany goat into ring at the judges request.

Refer to the Regulations and Other Information section for bedding and pen information. An additional \$10 per animal will be charged for any late entries postmarked after May 23, 2019. Pens are limited and available on a first come-first served basis.

Any class changes must be made prior to 6:00 pm on Friday, June 7. Show management reserves the right to combine or split classes. Naturally polled goats will be accepted. All goats must have premise identification ear tags complying with the National Scrapie Eradication Program ATTACHED TO THE ANIMAL. Call 866- USDA-TAG (866-873-2824) for help. Exhibit & Demonstrations Animals

It is the mission of the Estes Park Wool Market to provide a venue for goat owners and breeders to show their animals in competition, as well as educate the public in breed characteristics and the fiber industry.

All goats on the Wool Market property must be registered with show management in one of two ways:

The goat must be entered in one or more classes in either the Angora or Cashmere Goat Shows, or a youth class.

If a goat is not entered in a class then it will fall under the category of demonstration for educational purposes.

All Wool Market and Goat Show rules and regulations also apply to exhibit and demonstration animals.

Regulations & Other Information:

All goats must have health certificates issued by an accredited veterinarian in the state of origin, dated within the 21 days to be available on request to show superintendents before penning or stalling.

All goats are subject to re-examination by a veterinarian at the request of the superintendent. Any goat showing evidence of infectious, contagious or communicable diseases must be immediately withdrawn from the show and removed from the fairgrounds.

All goats must have premise identification ear tags that comply with the National Scrapie Eradication Program ATTACHED TO THE ANIMAL. Call 1- 866USDA-TAG (1-866-873-2824) for help. In Colorado call the USDA-APHIS Area Veterinary Services at 303-231-5385 for free tags.

Pens/Stalls:

Goat pen fees: \$10 per pen.

Fees are for Thursday, June 6 through Sunday June 9 at 4:00 p.m.

Early arrivals and stay-overs are welcome with prior arrangements made with the Fairgrounds office staff, no later than June 5th.

Pens are limited and available on a first come, first served basis.

Pens for early arrivals and late departures will result in a \$10 per pen per night charge for goats.

Pen position will be assigned by the superintendents.

Bedding/Feed:

Wood shavings, hay and straw can be purchased by contacting Town of Estes Park event staff at events@estes.org.

Veterinary Care:

A licensed veterinarian will be on-call to address emergency medical issues. The veterinarian will not be available for vet checks or health certificates.

Important Notes:

All animals are required to be penned in assigned stalls/pens. No outside penning is allowed; no animals are allowed to be kept in trailers. No stall/pen entries will be accepted without the animal show entry registration included. Only animals pre-registered in their animal category are allowed on the fairgrounds property.



Coming 36 from Lyons: After exiting the canyon, Vendors & Fleece/Fiber turn left onto 4th street and then left onto Rooftop Way (Events Complex parking lot). All others, make a left on community, then a right onto the Fairgrounds property.

Coming 34 from Loveland: Take a left on Highway 36 (the first stoplight in town). Vendors & Fleece/Fiber turn right onto 4th street, then left onto Rooftop Way (Events Complex parking lot). All others, make a right onto community, then a right onto the Fairgrounds property.
