2023 ALSA Llama Show w/ Alpaca Performance

This show is approved by the Alpaca and Llama Show Associations Inc. All rules and guidelines for this show will be in accordance with the 22nd Edition ALSA handbook. Your ALSA membership number and all ALSA Llama numbers must be on the registration to ensure accurate reporting to ALSA.

You may obtain more information on ALSA membership and/or an ALSA llama membership number by contacting the ALSA office at 281-516-1442. All llamas entered in approved classes, with the exception of youth classes, must be registered or have passed screening with the International Llama Registry (ILR) or the Canadian Livestock Record Corporation (CLRC). Alpacas must be registered by the Alpaca Owners Association (AOA), Alpaca Registry Inc. (ARI) or by the Canadian Livestock Record Corporation (CLRC).

If non-breeders are not registered and wish to be in the ALSA award system and wish to show in halter, they must show in the Adult Non-Breeder Halter Class.

Exhibitors must be registered owners and must make entries in the exact names (owner and animal) as shown on the llama's ILR registration certificate. A photocopy of the registration papers must be sent with the entry form for each breeding llama.

Exhibitor/owners may use "Permission to Show" form provided by ALSA which grants permission from the owner named on the registration certificate to a person who is using an animal to show under their name. Failure to meet these requirements prohibits entry in the show.

All llamas must be registered in the correct wool division as described in the 22nd Edition ALSA Handbook.

If not clearly visually evident, nonbreeder llamas must be accompanied by registration of a vet certificate verifying the llama is a gelding, a vasectomized male, or a spayed or non-productive female. Nursing llama mothers may NOT be accompanied in the ring by their babies. ALSA recommends not showing nursing mothers.

Llamas may not be moved from one class to another after halter judging has begun, except at the judge's discretion.

Youth may show in either the Youth Performance Classes OR Novice, Advanced, or Master's Performance, but not in both unless different llamas are used. Points earned in the Youth Classes are awarded to the youth, whereas points in Novice, Advance and Master's Performance are awarded to the llama.

Entry Fees:

Halter - \$30 (dual show)

Performance / Youth - \$15 / class

Fleece and Finished Product - \$15 Entry fee per class plus \$3 ALSA fee. (Waive ALSA Fee if llama is entered in halter, performance, or a youth division).

Special Youth Flat Rate Option: \$45 per youth exhibitor for both the Gold and Silver show - enter as many youth classes as you like, does not include halter.

Flat Rate Option for All Halter, Performance, Walking Fiber and Shorn Fleece:

\$70 per llama entered for both the Gold and Silver - enter as many classes as you like for each llama entered.

ALSA fees:

\$10 per llama / alpaca in dual show.

Non-member fee - \$50. ALSA Youth non-member fee - \$15.

Stall fees: \$30 per stall.

Registration Deadline: Entries must be postmarked by May 25, 2022.

Youth:

Senior - 15 to 18 years as of January 1, 2023
Intermediate - 12 to 14 years as of January 1, 2023
Junior- 8 to 11 years as of January 1, 2023
Exception- a youth who turns 8 on or before June 10, 2023
Sub-Junior- Under 8- not an ALSA point class

VERSATILITY CHAMPIONS! FREE!

One youth versatility champion and one open versatility champion will be awarded to the youth exhibitor / llama scoring the highest overall points using the ALSA point system for halter and fiber entries and scores for performance classes. Youth Versatility will be based on ALSA points and scores earned in the youth classes, including points for participating the “Walk a Llama”.

To be eligible for Open Llama Versatility the llama must be entered in, but not limited to, halter, one fleece class (shorn or walking), one performance class **and** participate in “Walk a Llama”. Scoring details will be available at check-in. Special prizes to be awarded to these champions. **This award is meant to represent “Versatility”**

NOTE: Show management reserves the right to cancel or combine classes if the number of entries in any individual class does not warrant a separate class. If fewer than four (4) alpacas are entered, the class will be combined with llama performance classes.
