JUDGING CRITERIA: A judge will rank the contestants using the following criteria. The Champion and Reserve Champion will be determined the judge may ask questions as they are judging; 80% of score is exhibitor and 20% is sheep

REGULATIONS:

1. Contestants will abide by all applicable rules of the Estes Park Wool Festival and should familiarize themselves with these rules before entering.
2. Contestants participating in this contest should have a sheep and wool interest to promote the industry.
3. Contestants must provide their own outfits which must be 50% to 100% wool. Outfits may be either handmade or purchased.
4. Contestants must submit a typewritten script at time of entry. As read aloud, script should be 3-5 minutes in length please. Script should include description of garment (i.e. design, style, colors, percent of wool, hand sewn by whom or if it was purchased), breed of sheep being led, owners of the sheep and their farm if not their own. Script may include hobbies, personal goals or interests, 4-H/FFA projects, honors or awards, school activities, interest in and/or experience with sheep and wool.
5. Contestant will enter one of four age classes based on age as of January 1st 2018.
6. Sheep of any breed may be used for Lads & Ladies Lead. Sheep must be conditioned, groomed and trained to show at halter. Sheep being shown must be entered in one of the show classes at the Estes Park Wool Festival. Contestant may lead their own sheep or arranged to use a sheep belonging to any sheep exhibitor at the Estes Park Wool Festival and must follow all applicable rules. All awards are given to the contestants. (No Rams will be allowed)
7. Mini Little Lad and Lassies contestants will not be ranked. All of these contestants will receive participation awards and or a trophy.
8. Intermediate, Junior, and Senior contestants will have their own class.
